



Youth Garden Project Community Supported Agriculture Membership Agreement 2010

The Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program consists of a community of individuals who pledge support to the Youth Garden Project so that the garden becomes the community's farm, with the growers and members providing mutual support and sharing the risks and benefits of organic food production. Members share in the risks of farming, including poor harvests due to unfavorable weather, pests or disease. Members in return then share in the bounty of the garden throughout the growing season in the form of fresh, just harvested organic food, as well as the satisfaction of participating directly with food producers. Rhonda Gotway, YGP's farmer, does all of the planning, preparation and oversight of the CSA plot. The CSA garden is staffed by AmeriCorps Apprentices, providing important learning and vocational opportunities for youth interested in agricultural careers.

DETAILS

- Produce available to participants weekly, June through October, for approximately 20 weeks, depending on fall frosts.
- Pick up at the Youth Garden Project on Thursdays from 3 to 7 PM (Delivery option available).
- Any produce not picked up on Thursdays will be donated to local organizations or agencies or sold at the Moab Farmers' Market to benefit the Youth Garden Project.
- The CSA garden is the fenced area on the Northwest side of the Youth Garden Project. It supports a total of 26 shares. Soil and planting is carefully managed to maximize growing in a small area. The CSA garden has been the last area of the Youth Garden Project to frost, which allows for a slightly longer growing season for that spot. Occasionally, when over abundance allows, we will add additional produce from outside the CSA plot as a bonus for our CSA members.

Members Share Prices:

\$300.00 for one share: A single share is designed for one to two person households.

\$575.00 for two shares: A double share is for a three to four person household or for a smaller household that wants to eat primarily vegetables or preserve fruits and vegetables for use at other times of the year.

Delivery to your home or business is also available for an additional fee of \$100 for the season (delivery area boundary is Spanish Trail Road).
