Crystalline Ice Plant	Grand Prismatic Seed	Crunchy, tangy, salty, snack! We love that this gorgeous ornamental is also a delicious vegetable. Crystalline ice plant is the disco ball of the plant world. The leaves, stems, and flower buds are covered in sparkly epidermal bladder cells filled with salt water that sparkle in sunlight. Legend has it, this plant is the source of Elton John's power, and the inspiration for the majority of his fabulous looks.

Spilanthes	Snake River Seed Cooperative	Chew the flowers or leaves for an epic, crazy 3 minute mouth experience! Also called Toothache Plant, it's an unbelievable sensation in the mouth. Highly medicinal & gives you a tingly clean mouth and a surge of energy. Attractive bedding plant, good companion. Amaze your friends!
Ground Cherry, Aunt Molly's	Yellow. High Desert Seeds.	This yellow berry is closely related to a tomatillo with an acidic tang and wild sweet taste. Very tasty with hints of pineapple. These plants do well in poor soils and are resilient in drought conditions.
Kale, Red Russian	Johnny's Selected Seeds.	Stems are purple; leaves are flat, toothed, and dark green with purple veins. The plants mature medium-tall and leaves are tender compared to other kales. For salads and light cooking.
Kale, Lacinato	Italian. Organic. Seed Savers Exchange	(aka Dinosaur, Nero di Toscana) Italian kale which reportedly dates back to the 18th century. Blue-green strap-like leaves are 3" wide by 10-18" long with a heavily savoyed texture. Excellent flavor that is enhanced by frost. Best eaten when leaves are small and tender
Cabbage, Copenhagen Market	Heirloom. Botanical Interest	Introduced by H. Hartman & Company in 1909, this Denmark original has been a gardeners' favorite for over a century and is the standard of excellence for many varieties that were developed after it! Cabbage heads are 6"-8" in diameter and 3-4 pounds, tightly-wrapped, and perfect for small gardens. Adaptable to a range of climates. Resists splitting and stores up to 6 months.
Cabbage, Omero	Red. Johnny's Selected Seeds	The avg. 3 lb. heads are a vibrant bright red and are round to slightly oval. Good, slightly sweet and peppery flavor. Suitable for planting at close spacing to produce mini heads.
Cauliflower, Early Snowball	Heirloom. Botanical Interest	Enjoyed in the United States since 1888, and a favorite of gardeners for its early, high-quality, tightly packed heads. Pepper, Hot Rod	Johnny's Selected Seeds.	Hot Rod is a traditional serrano with avg 3" fruits borne on big plants over a long harvest period. The dark green fruits are traditionally eaten green but also make fine chipotles if allowed to ripen to red.
Pepper, Padron	Johnny's Selected Seeds.	Named after the town where they originated. Harvest Padron peppers when they are 1-1 1/2" long. About 1 out of 20 fruits will be hot, and the rest mild. All the fruits become hot if allowed to grow 2-3" long.
Pepper, Chimayó	Mild chile. Heirloom. High Desert Seeds.	An heirloom from the tiny New Mexican village where it gets its namesake. It matures early, and makes an excellent chili powder that has a mild heat, with fruity, deep chocolate notes.
Pepper, El Jefe	Jalapeño, hot, hybrid. Johnny's Selected Seeds.	Best combination of earliness and yield in a jalapeno. Fruits avg. 3 1/2-4" on large plants.
Pepper, Jimmy Nardello	Sweet. Italian frying. High Desert Seed	This sweet pepper has a legendary sweet, rich flavor. The plant produces early-maturing long, thin, red Italian frying peppers that are less vulnerable to sunscald.
Pepper, Habanero	Heirloom, Very Hot. Organic. Johnny's Selected Seeds.	Wrinkled fruits ripen from dark green to orange. Extremely pungent fruits have a delicious exotic sweetness that accompanies the considerable heat.
Pepper, Hatch Big Jim	Warm. New Mexico green chile. Sandia Seed Company.	This hot pepper has a great flavor with thick meaty pods. A famous variety from New Mexico in a region with a similar climate and elevation to Moab.
Pepper, Lunchbox	Sweet. organic. Johnny's Selected Seeds.	Yellow and orange "Lunchbox" snack bell peppers have been combined in this mix. These beautiful, mini-sized peppers are remarkably sweet and flavorful. They are delicious sautéed, as an addition to salads and perfect for a snack. Dense foliage protects fruits from sunscald.
Pepper, Chilhuacle Negro	Organic. Adaptive Seeds	Chilhuacle Negro, A very ancient and rare chile that grows in Oaxaca, Mexico. Said to be one of the most flavorful chilis and has a deep, intense fruit flavor, with tones of dried plum, tobacco, and liquorice.
Pepper, Goddess	Johnny's Selected Seeds.	Sweet banana for pickling or fresh eating. Long, thick-walled, smooth fruits are borne on large plants. Avg. 8-9" long, the fruits are mild when yellow and moderately sweet when they ripen red.
Pepper, Garden Sunshine	Snake River Seed Cooperative	Plant produces heavy yields of 4" long by 4" wide sweet bell peppers. Peppers turn from creamy yellow, to orange, to red when mature.

Pepper, Piquillo	Roasting Pepper.Snake River Seed Cooperative	Small to medium sized, blocky and pointed peppers can grow to 2-4". Fruits ripen to red and have a unique spicy-sweet flavor with low to no heat. Piquillo means 'little beak'.
Pepper, Numex Joe E Parker	Warm. Open pollinated, Botanical Interests.	Great multipurpose chile for processing and fresh market. Medium-tall plant; for many the most productive traditional Anaheim type. Uniform fruits are the traditional semi-flattened shape.
Pepper, Serrano	Hot, heirloom. Botanical Interests.	Popular in Mexican cuisine, these peppers have a distinctive, spicy flavor required for many dishes. A versatile pepper for cooking, with prolific, productive plants.
Pepper, Shishito	Mostly mild, some hot. Snake River Seed Cooperative.	These rich and delicious thin skinned frying peppers are flavorful and mostly mild, with a one in ten chance of being hot. Best fried or grilled.
Pepper, Sugar Rush Peach.	Sweet and spicy. Baker Creek Heirloom Seed Company.	This snacking pepper is long and peach colored, packed with super sweet, tropical flavor. The seeds have a complex, smokey heat, which creates a great combination of flavor with the sweet fruit.
Squash, Honey Bear Acorn	Winter Squash. Johnny's Selected Seeds. Hybrid.	Early, large fruits with an attractive shape, and great flavor. Semi-bush plant. Avg. yield: 3-4 fruits/plant.
Pumpkin, Cinderella	Botanical Interest	Deeply ridged 12"-24" and weighs 15-20 pounds. It's a terrific decoration whether carved or not. Moderately sweet; perfect for baking and canning. The inspiration for the carriage in the charming fairy tale.

Squash, Dill's Atlantic Giant	Johnny's Select Seeds	The world's record for size — originator's stock. Huge pinkish or orange fruits for fall display. 50 to 100 pounders are commonly grown. Fertile soil, irrigation, wide spacing (70 or more sq.ft./plant), and limiting each long-vined plant to one fruit commonly results in 200-300 pounders. The current world record is an Atlantic Giant of over 2,000 lb. We offer seeds from the originator, Howard Dill of Nova Scotia. Avg. yield: 1-2 fruits/plant. Avg. 1,660 seeds/lb. Packet: 15 seeds.
